Recently, there have been more South Asian girl leads in popular television shows like, *Never Have I Ever* (2020–2023). These shows have themes of girlhood and even **feminism**, but sometimes use <u>stereotypes</u> about South Asian people and gender identity to attract mainstream audiences.

Girls who learn about feminism or their own **identities** through <u>popular culture</u> shape their personal views by these popular representations, which can be *limiting* or *harmful*.

I'm interested in how girls engage with media representations of their South Asian girlhood, how they talk about it on social media – and how this can be a form of activism.
