The Kokum (Grandmother in Nêhiyaw/Cree) scarf represents the longstanding relationship between the Ukrainian people who faced discrimination from other settlers when they started to immigrate to Turtle Island (North America) in 1891 and the First Peoples.

Because the Ukrainian settlers were treated with respect and dignity by the First Peoples, they were gifted with scarves for their kindness and generosity by the Ukrainian peoples. Kokum scarves represent solidarity against oppression and oppressors.
